Type of Learning:



A 'Do Now' is a quick, focused activity that students complete immediately upon entering the classroom, usually within the first 5-10 minutes. It's designed to activate thinking, reinforce prior learning or transition smoothly into the day's lesson. Teachers can use it to establish routines, create active learning, and to maximise instructional time.

Facilitators choose one option from the table below to complete with their PLT.

Option 1: Learning about Collaboration through Tableaux

Facilitators invite 4–6 volunteers to create a tableau (frozen image) using their bodies.

1. First Tableau: The Harbour Bridge

- Volunteers have 10 seconds to form the Harbour Bridge.
 They may speak during this time.
- · Observers are asked to watch closely and consider:
 - · What are participants doing to make this successful?
 - How are they demonstrating collaboration?
- Facilitators then guide a brief reflection, drawing out ideas around collaboration, such as:
 - Communication
 - Offering
 - Yielding
 - Advancing and Extending

Sentence Starters for Observers:

- · "I noticed they worked together by..."
- · "It was effective when someone..."
- "They showed collaboration through..."

2. Second Tableau: The Sydney Opera House

- A new group/same group of volunteers is invited to form the Opera House.
- o Observers again reflect on what they see, with a focus on:
 - Changes in approach
 - New strategies
 - · Continued collaboration
