Dear MLC School Year 10 Parents and Carers,

**Re: Year 10 Careers Profiling and Work Experience Program**

As part of the comprehensive careers program for Year 10, students will undertake an in-depth careers assessment, similar to those offered by private career consultants.

Dr Marian Kratzing of [Career Avenues](#) will conduct the testing at MLC School on **Thursday 5 February 2026**, from **8.15am to 12.45pm** (with breaks). Each student will receive an individually prepared report, which will be made available online on **Wednesday 11 February**. The cost to students is \$155.

Following this, students will have the opportunity to meet with a Career Avenues practitioner for a 30-minute interview to unpack their profile with interviews conducted online between **Monday 23 February and Monday 3 March 2026**. Parents are welcome to attend these online interviews and can join remotely via the Zoom link provided to their child.

The interviews provide a valuable opportunity for students to understand their report's findings and learn how to apply this information in their career research. These reports also offer insights into each student's unique traits and preferences, helping them to better understand how these influence their learning styles and potential career pathways. This information will be used throughout Year 10 during Luminary sessions to support career exploration and will assist students in selecting the most suitable subjects for Year 11 and 12. Additionally, the reports will guide ongoing career and study discussions with the Careers Department during the senior years.



We are also pleased to announce that a fixed week of **work experience** will be happening in the week **Monday 30 November to Friday 4 December 2026** to allow students to explore career interests, develop workplace skills, and gain practical insights into professional environments, helping them make informed decisions about their future.

Students will receive support through our Careers Program to help guide students to find suitable placements, however, we encourage families to begin sourcing placements for their daughter as soon as possible as it is a common time of year for other schools to also embark on work experience.
