Capital Projects

- Air-conditioning upgrades (2027).
- Staffing: Ashley Brenner (Sports Nutritionist, Term 4 start no GP referral required) and a new Performance Psychologist joining.
- Grey House Precinct:
 - o New Wellbeing Centre (integrating nurses and site team).
 - Early School
 - o Two open-air courtyards (student-feedback relaxation space).
 - Six dance studios.
 - Conde Library upgrade (2026).
 - o Healthcare team moving to GHP; Boarding to return to Joan Hammond House.
 - Temporary Conde Library relocation to front reception.

Curriculum Update – Christine Kenny, Deputy Principal Academic (K-12)

- NESA feedback reviewed.
- Year 12: 50 subjects available (ranging from Agriculture to Investigative Science, Dance, Performing Arts).
- Biotechnology offered in 2026 (developed with Boston Center for Curriculum Redesign).
- Cambridge Programs: Registered as a Cambridge School. Year 10 Cambridge Maths in 2025; exams in October.
- Global Perspectives (Year 9, 2026).
- Engineering introduced in Year 11.
- Aviation & Space Expo: Designed to inspire subject and career choices.

Drone Academy - Jake Turnbull, Digital Learning Leader

- 50 girls enrolled, with a waitlist.
- Program includes drone flying, coding, competitions, and new *Drone Soccer*.
- Students able to gain drone licenses.
- Practical applications (e.g., farm projects).
- In 2026, Pymble will be the first Australian school to compete in the U.S.
